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
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County-wide Preliminary Data: 1/1/20 – 7/31/20

Type of Incident: 1/1/20 – 7/31/20



There were a total of **838 incidents (OD and At-Risk)** recorded in Plymouth County between 1/1/20 and 7/31/20: **81 (10%) were fatal; 651 (78%) were non-fatal**; and 106 (12%) were categorized as "at-risk" individuals.

Fatal Incident Monthly Trend

There was on average <u>11.6 fatal ODs per month, or 81 total</u>, in the County between 1/1/20 and 7/31/20. This is a <u>5% decrease</u> over the 2019 monthly average of 12.2 or 85 total, for the same time frame.

Non-Fatal Incident Monthly Trend

—2020 **—**2019 **—**2018




There was on average <u>93 non-fatal ODs per month, or 651 total</u>, in the County between 1/1/20 and 7/31/20. This is a <u><1% decrease</u> over the 2019 monthly average of 93.4, or 654 total, for the same time frame. Note, there was a 23% increase in non-fatal overdoses between June 2020 and July 2020.

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
At-Risk Monthly Trend

There was on average <u>15.1 At-Risk</u> entries per month, or 106 total, in the County between 1/1/20 and 7/31/20. This is an <u>3% increase</u> over the 2019 monthly average of 14.7, or 103 total, for the same time frame.

Incident vs. Resident Town: 1/1/20 – 7/31/20



Analyzing just the 732 overdose incidents, **508 (69%)** of the OD incidents between 1/1/20 and 7/31/20 occurred **i**n same town that the person lived in. However, in **224 (31%)** of the incidents the person was from a different town than where the incident occurred.

Naloxone "Saves": 1/1/20 – 7/31/20 Kelley Research Associates 6% **Twenty percent** (143) of these incidents involved Naloxone being administered by a 3rd party 94% family/friend prior to first responders arriving. **Fatal**

Again, analyzing just the 732 overdose incidents, Naloxone was administered in **504** (69%) of the reported OD incidents. Ninety-four percent (473) of these events were non-fatal, while 6% (31) of these overdoses resulted in a fatality.



Fifty-four percent (147) of the successful follow-up visits (274) resulted in contact with the individual that had overdosed, <u>35% (97)</u> resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and <u>11% (30)</u> resulted in contact with both the individual and family/friends.

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Successful SUD Contact Outcomes 1/1/20 – 7/31/20




Of the 177 successful contacts with the person the overdosed (SUD Only and Both): <u>67% (119)</u> resulted in the individual accepting treatment from the outreach team; <u>14% (25)</u> declined the treatment options; <u>14% (24)</u> of individuals were already seeking treatment; and <u>5% (9)</u> of the follow-ups did not have a response to these measures recorded in the system.

Tier 2 Follow-Up Analysis

Tier 2: Follow-Up Visit Contacts 1/1/20 – 7/31/20


- <u>322</u> attempted outreach visits (inperson, phone, electronic, other)
- 63% (202) were successful in having contact with either the individual who overdosed, a family/friend, or both.



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<u>Seventy-three percent (148)</u> of the successful follow-up visits (202) resulted in contact with the Tier 2 client, <u>17% (35)</u> resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and <u>10% (19)</u> resulted in contact with both the Tier 2 client and family/friends.

Tier 2: Successful SUD Contact Outcomes 1/1/20 – 7/31/20



Of the 167 successful contacts with the Tier 2 client (SUD Only and Both): <u>30% (50)</u> resulted in the individual accepting treatment from the outreach team; <u>3% (5)</u> declined the treatment options; <u>59% (99)</u> of individuals was already seeking treatment; and <u>8% (13)</u> of the follow-ups did not have a response to these measures recorded in the system.

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
