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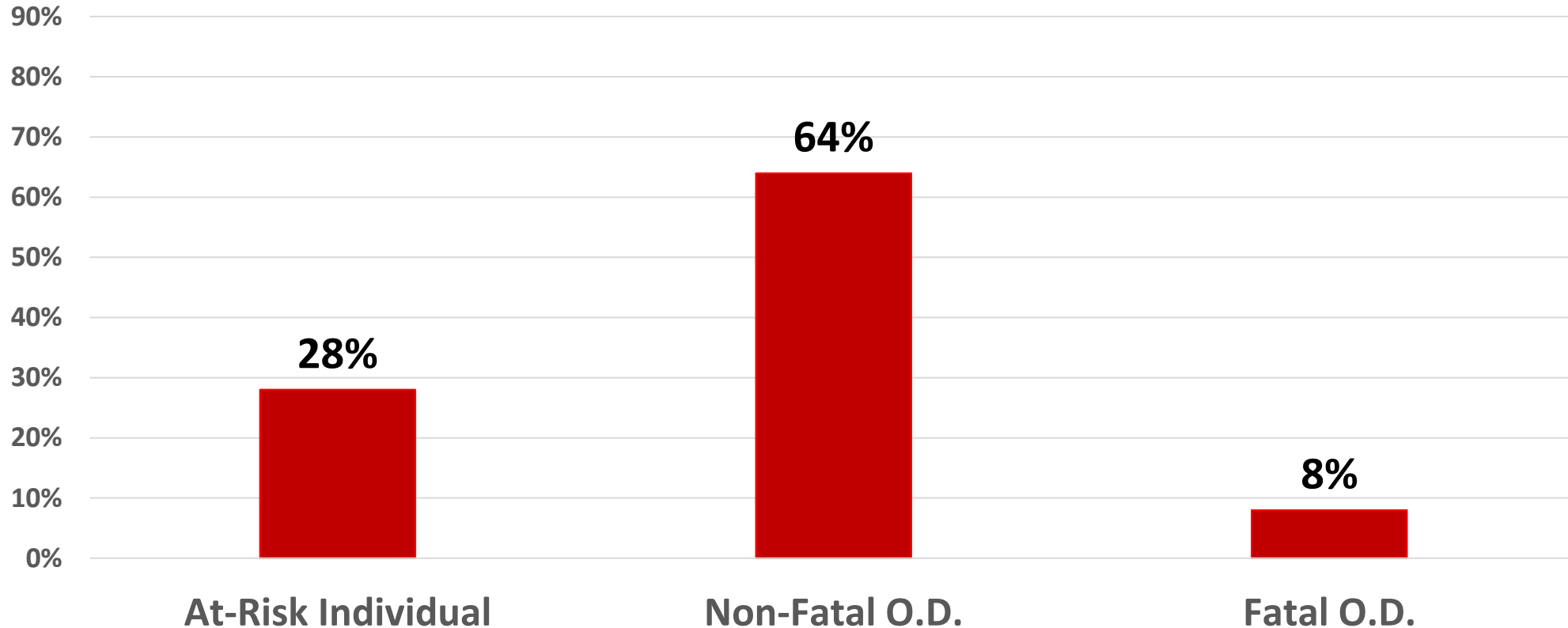


# **County-Wide Preliminary Data:**

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***1/1/21 – 12/31/21***

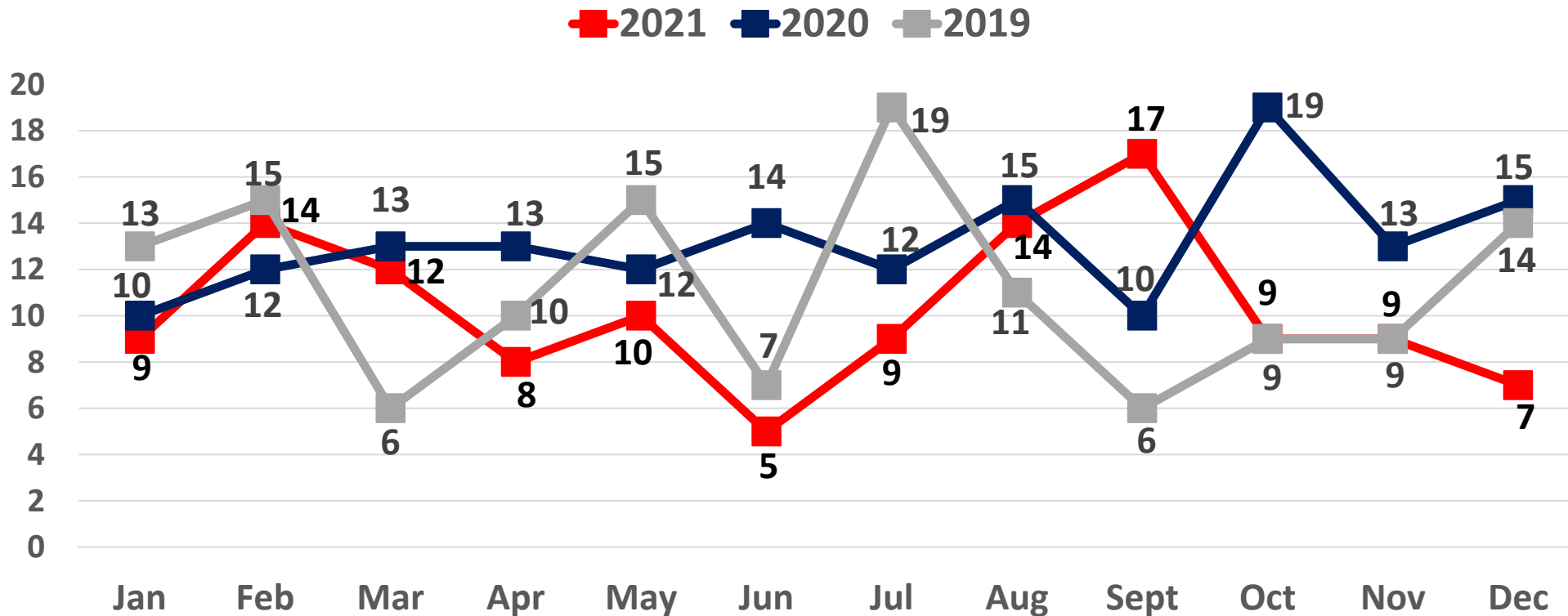
# Type of Incident: 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



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There were a total of **1,489 incidents (OD and At-Risk)** recorded in Plymouth County between 1/1/21 and 12/31/21: **123 (8%) were fatal; 947 (64%) were non-fatal;** and 419 (28%) were categorized as “at-risk” individuals.

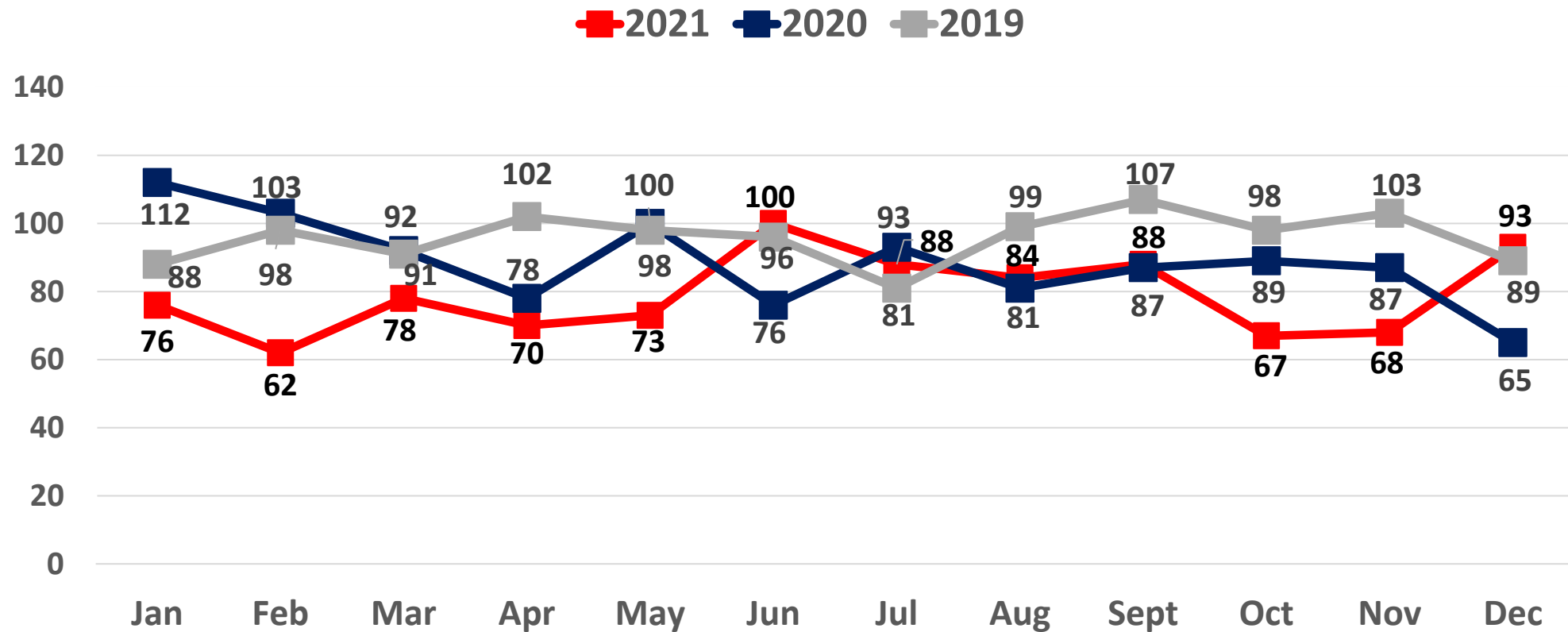
# Fatal Incident Monthly Trend



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There was on average **10.3 fatal ODs per month, or 123 total**, in the County between 1/1/21 and 12/31/21. This is **a 22% decrease** over the 2020 monthly average of 13.2 or 158 total, for the same time frame.

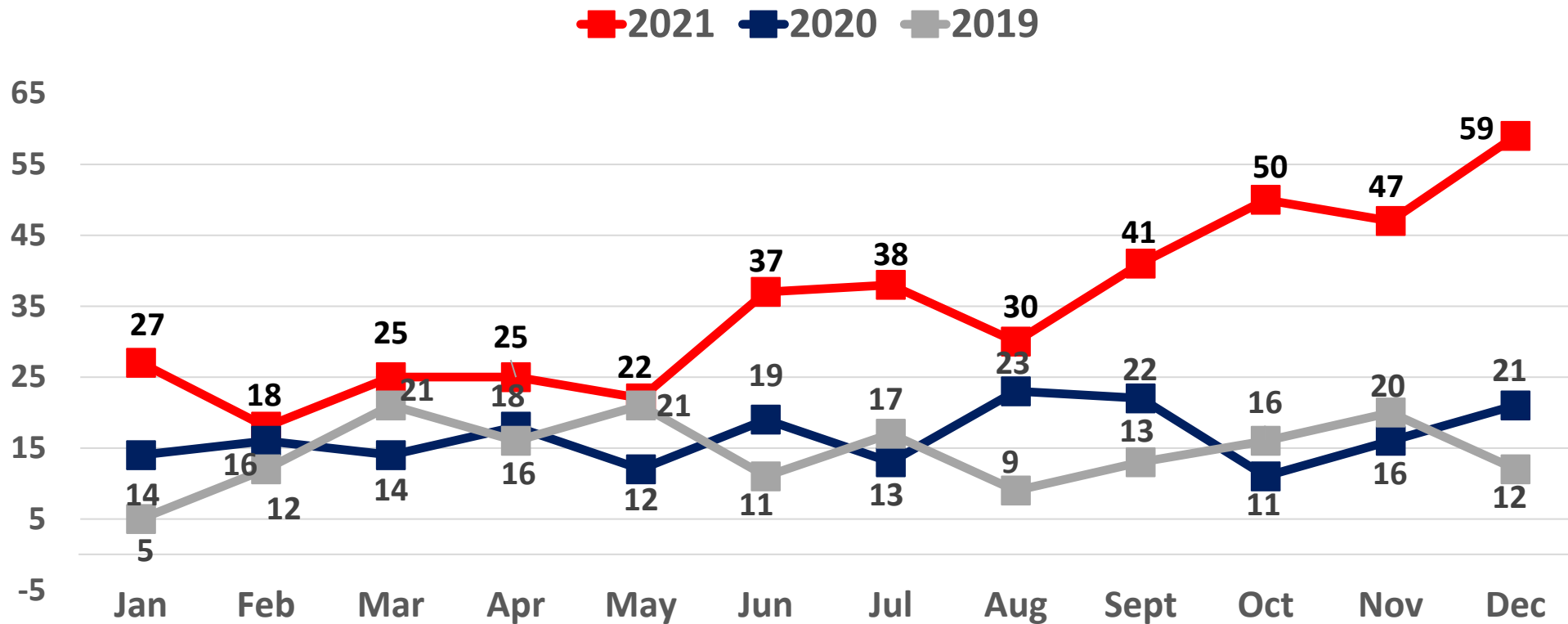
# Non-Fatal Incident Monthly Trend



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There was on average 78.9 non-fatal ODs per month, or 947 total, in the County between 1/1/21 and 12/31/21. This is an 11% decrease over the 2020 monthly average of 88.6, or 1,063 total, for the same time frame.

# At-Risk Monthly Trend

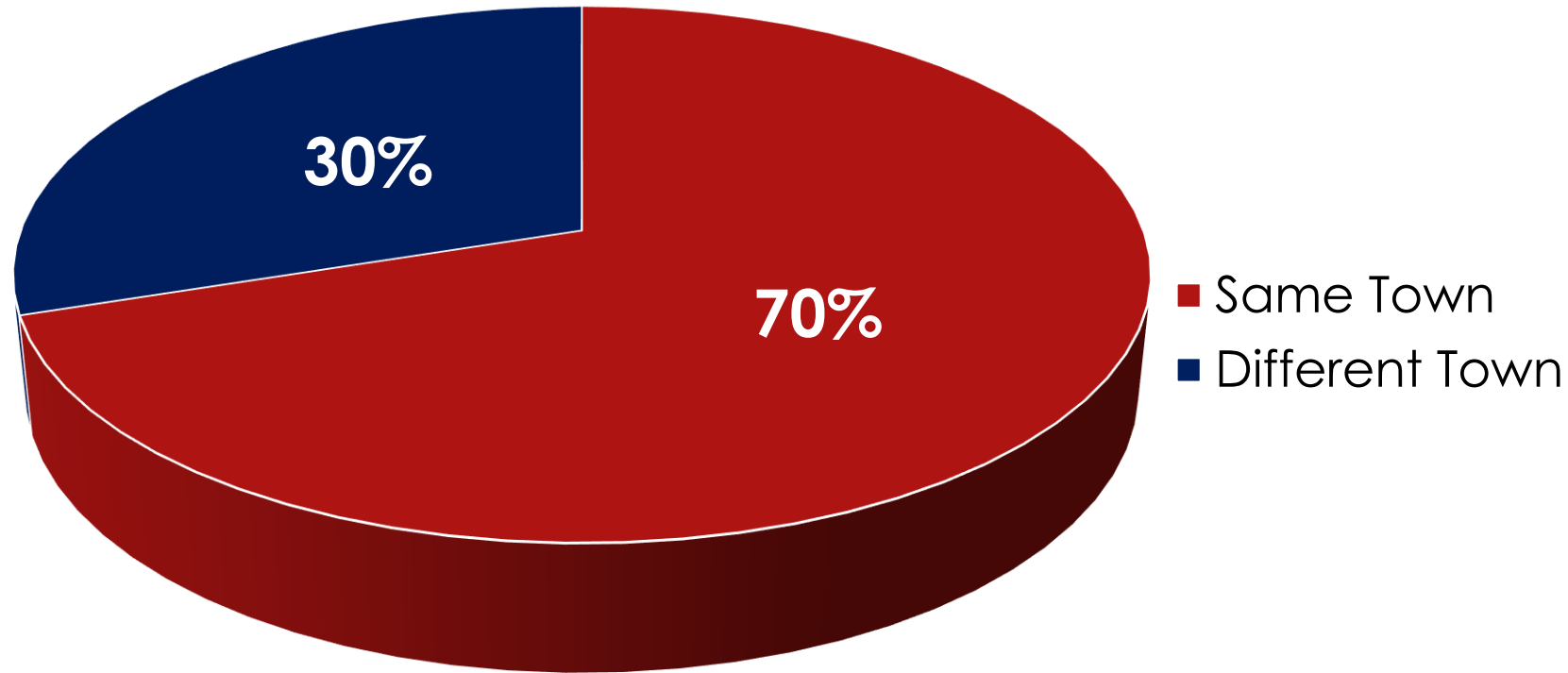


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There was on average **34.9 At-Risk entries per month, or 419 total**, in the County between 1/1/21 and 12/31/21. This is a **111% increase** over the 2020 monthly average of 16.6, or 199 total, for the same time frame.

# Incident vs. Resident Town: 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



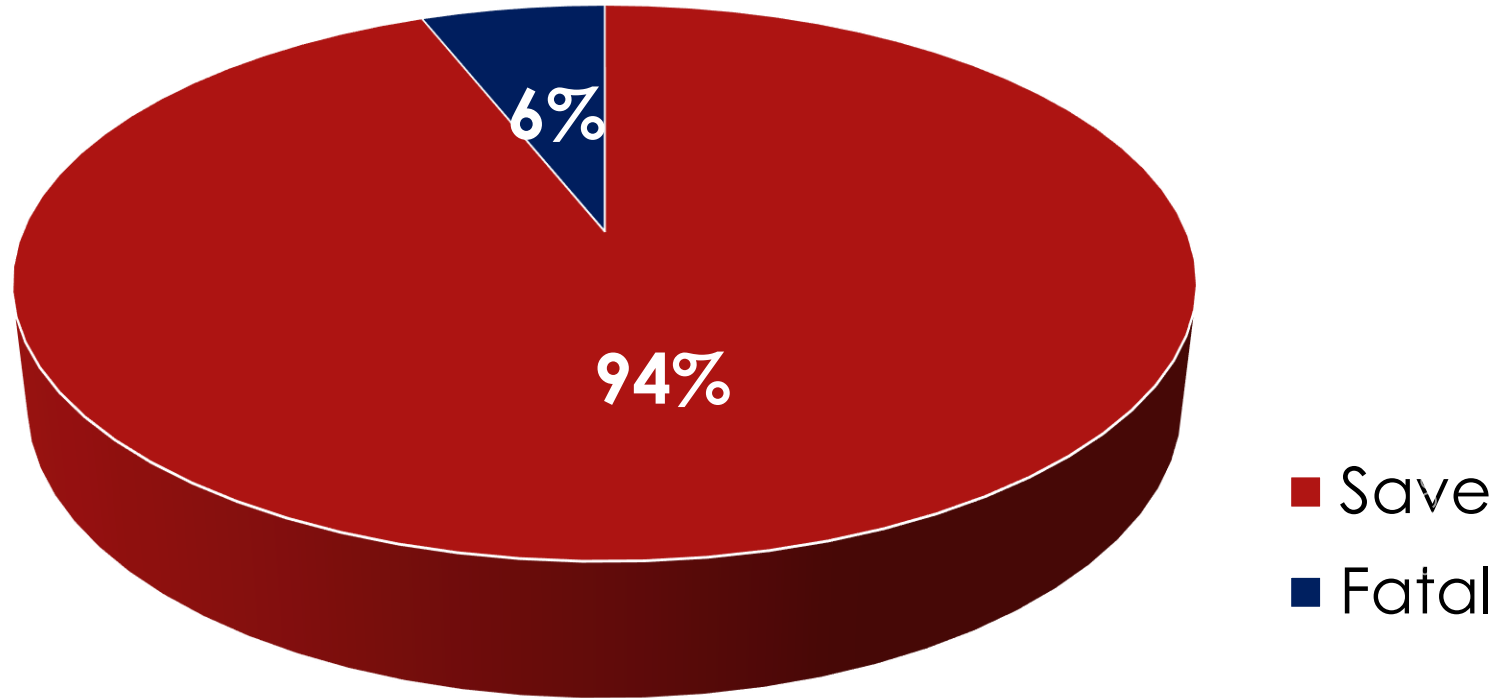
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Analyzing just the 1,070 overdose incidents, **753 (70%)** of the OD incidents between 1/1/21 and 12/31/21 occurred in same town that the person lived in. However, in **317 (30%)** of the incidents the person was from a different town than where the incident occurred.

# Naloxone "Saves": 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



Twenty-six percent (185) of these incidents involved Naloxone being administered by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party family/friend prior to first responders arriving.



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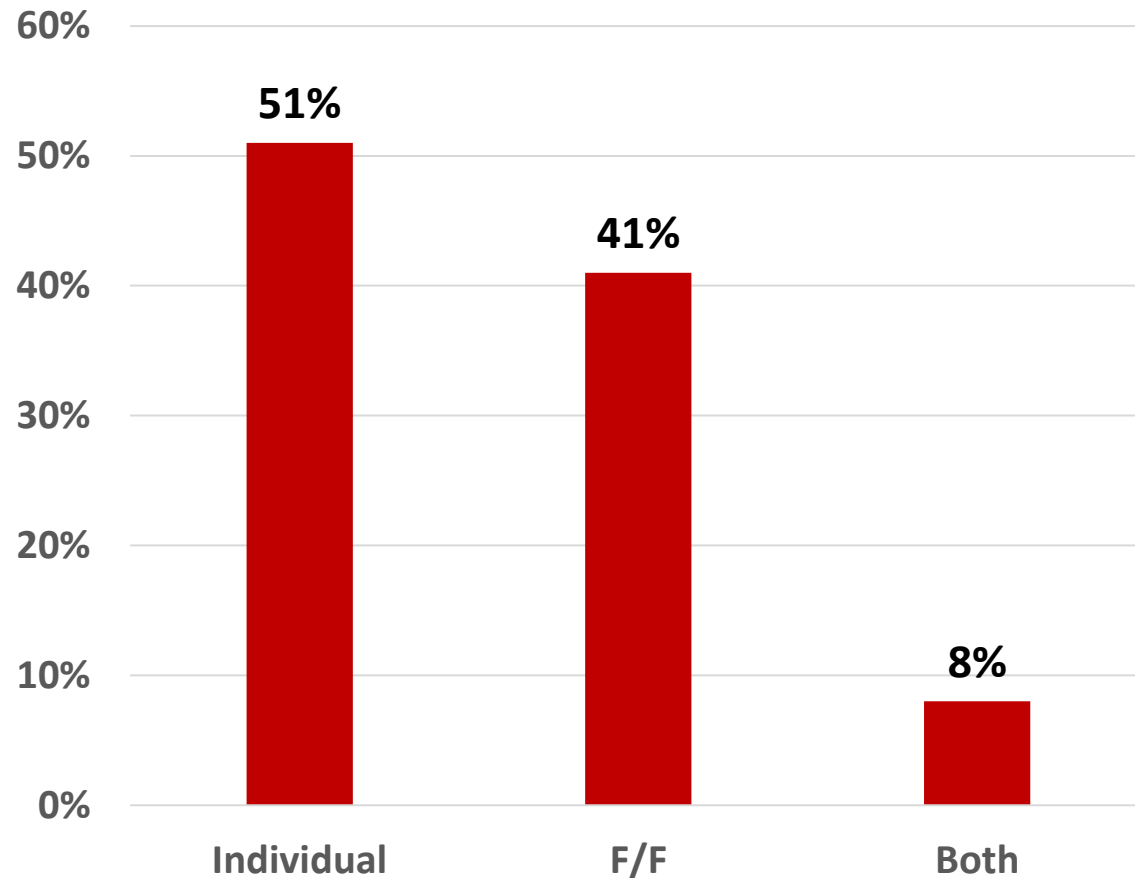
Again, analyzing just the 1,070 overdose incidents, Naloxone was administered in **718 (67%)** of the reported OD incidents. **Ninety-four percent (676)** of these events were non-fatal, while **6% (42)** of these overdoses resulted in a fatality.



# Follow-Up Visit Contacts: 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



- **1,344** attempted Follow-up Contacts
- **60% (809)** were successful in having contact with either the individual who overdosed, a family/friend, or both.



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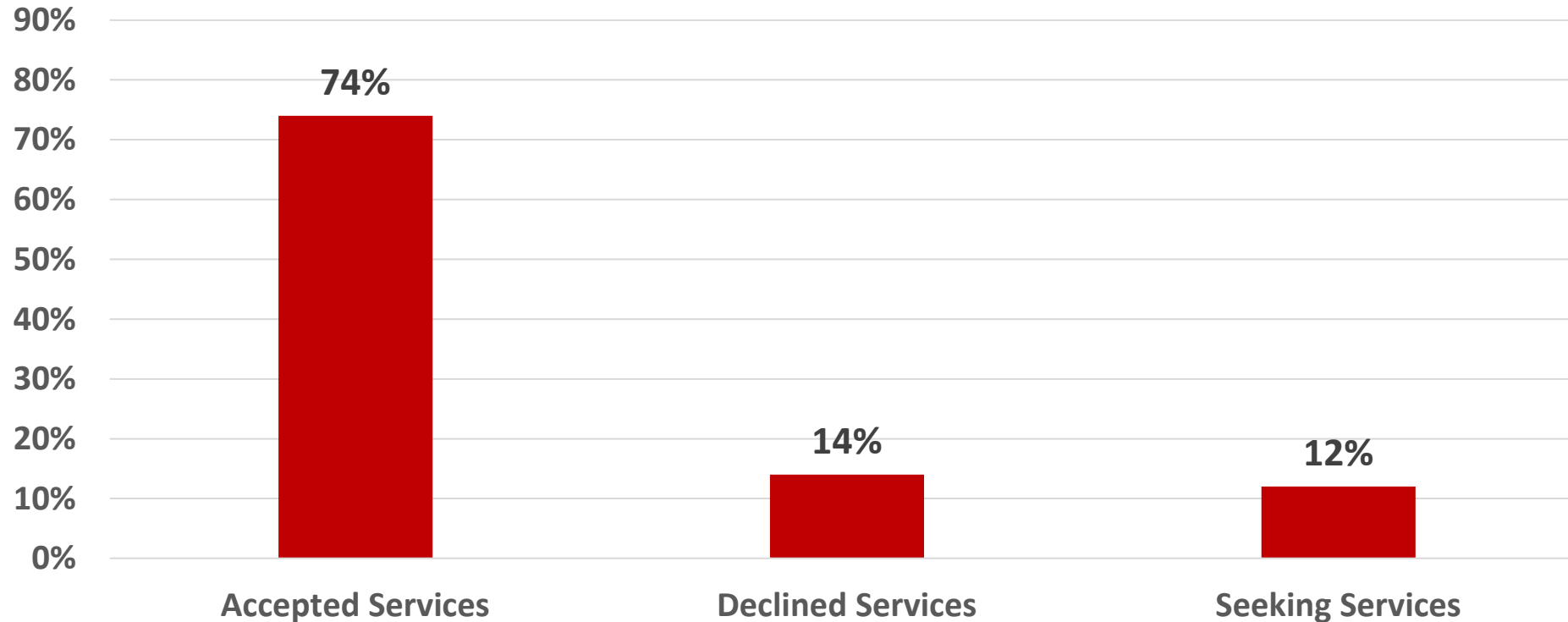
**Fifty-one percent (411)** of the successful follow-up visits (809) resulted in contact with the individual that had overdosed or was referred, **41% (331)** resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and **8% (67)** resulted in contact with both the individual and family/friends.

# Successful Contact Outcomes

## 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



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Of the 478 successful contacts with the person that overdosed or was referred (Individual Only and Both): **74% (354)** resulted in the individual accepting services from the outreach team; **14% (66)** declined the offer of services; and **12% (58)** of individuals were already seeking services.

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# Tier 2 Follow-Up Analysis

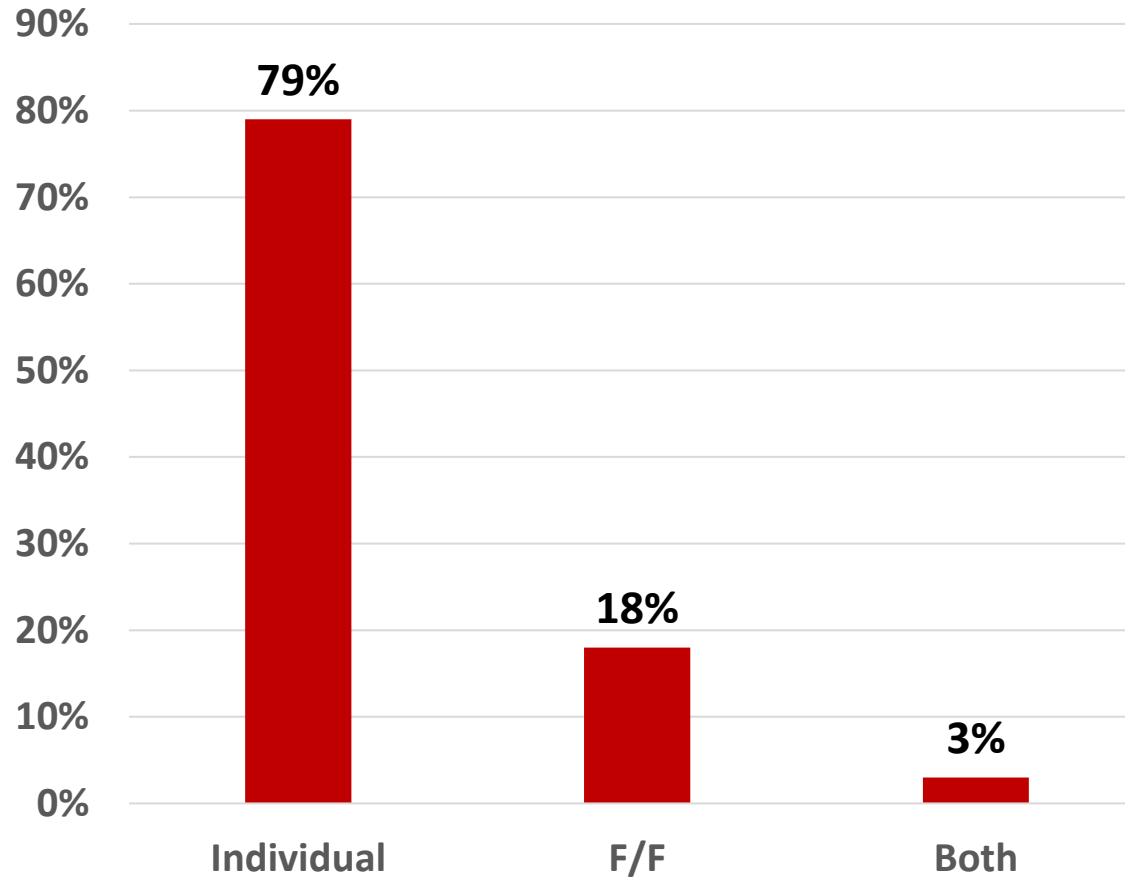
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# Tier 2: Follow-Up Visit Contacts: 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



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- **1,203** attempted outreach visits (in-person, phone, electronic, other)
- **54% (648)** were successful in having contact with either the individual who overdosed, a family/friend, or both.



**Seventy-nine percent (511)** of the successful follow-up visits (648) resulted in contact with the Tier 2 client, **18% (118)** resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and **3% (19)** resulted in contact with both the Tier 2 client and family/friends.

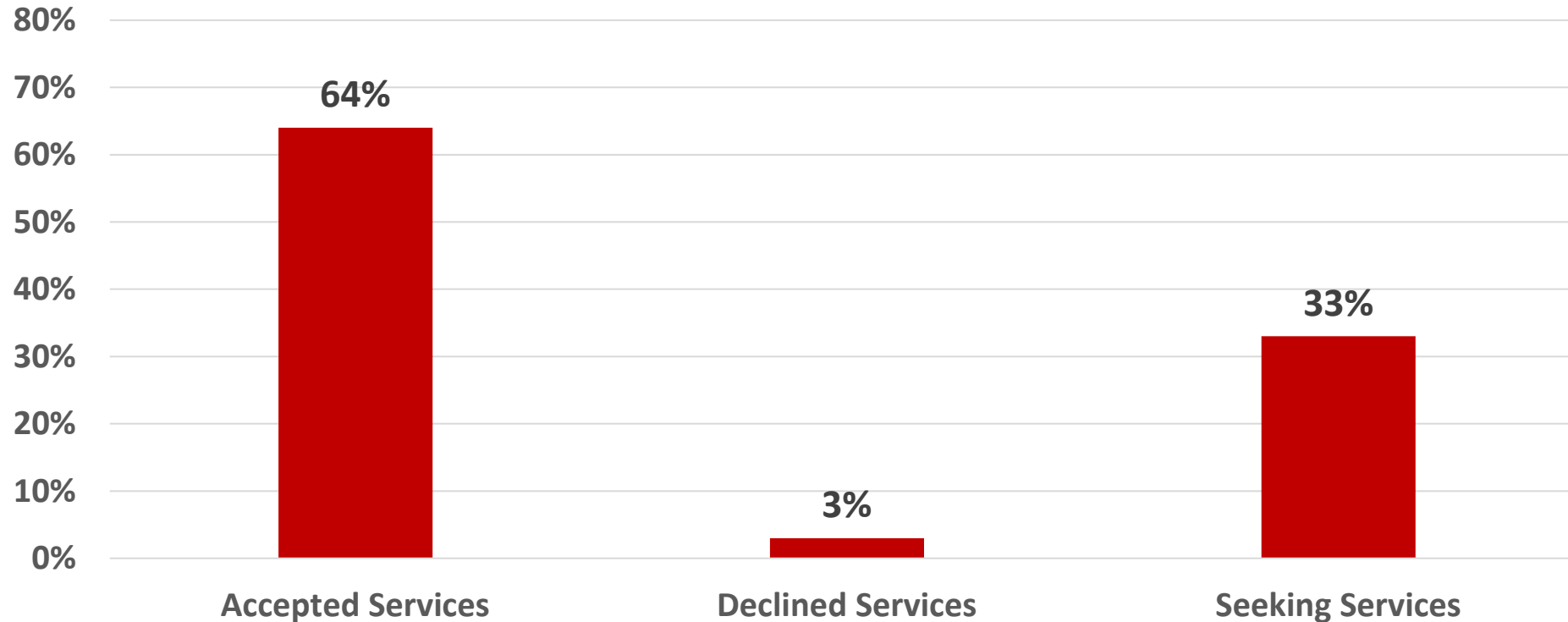
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# Tier 2: Successful Contact Outcomes

## 1/1/21 – 12/31/21



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Of the 530 successful contacts with the Tier 2 client (Individual Only and Both): **64% (340)** resulted in the individual accepting services from the outreach team; **3% (14)** declined the offer of services; and **33% (176)** of individuals were already seeking services.
