


COUNTY- WIDE ANNUAL REPORT DATA 1/1/2022 - 12/31/2033

Type of Incident: 1/1/22 – 12/31/22






There were a total of 1,499 incidents (OD and At-Risk) recorded in Plymouth County between 1/1/22 and 12/31/22: 125 (8%) were fatal; 822 (55%) were non-fatal; and 552 (37%) were categorized as "at-risk" individuals.

Fatal Incident 3-Yr Monthly Trend






There was on average 10.4 fatal ODs per month, or 125 total, in the County between 1/1/22 and 12/31/22. This is a 4% decrease over the 2021 monthly average of 10.8 or 130 total, for the same time frame and a 21% decrease over the 2020 monthly average of 13.2 or 158.

Non-Fatal Incident 3-Yr Monthly Trend






There was on average <u>68.5 non-fatal ODs per month</u>, or <u>822 total</u>, in the County between 1/1/22 and 12/31/22. This is a <u>13% decrease</u> over the 2021 monthly average of 78.9, or 947 total, for the same time frame and a 23% decrease over the 2020 monthly average of 88.6 or 1,063.

At-Risk 3 Yr Monthly Trend







There was on average <u>46 At-Risk entries per month</u>, or <u>552 total</u>, in the County between 1/1/22 and 12/31/22. This is a <u>32% increase</u> over the 2021 monthly average of 34.9, or 419 total, for the same time frame and a 177% increase over the 2020 monthly average of 16.6 or 199.



Top Six Communities

• 76% (723) of the total fatal and non-fatal overdose incidents (947) occurred within six cities/towns in Plymouth County including:

Brockton 402 (42%)

Plymouth 106 (11%)

Wareham 87 (9%)

Middleborough 57 (6%)


Rockland 39 (4%)

Age Range




- 48% (617) of the individuals involved in an overdose or at-risk referral were between the ages of 30 49.
- The youngest individual was 13 years old and the oldest was 89 years old.
- The youngest Fatal OD involved a <u>22 year old</u> and the oldest Fatal OD involved a <u>66 year old</u>.



Follow-Up Visit Contacts




- 1,281 attempted Follow-Up Contacts
- 51% (653) were successful in having contact with either the individual who overdosed, a family/friend, or both.



<u>Forty-four percent (287)</u> of the successful follow-up visits (653) resulted in contact with the individual that had overdosed or was referred, <u>47% (307)</u> resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and <u>9% (59)</u> resulted in contact with both the individual and family/friends.

Successful Client Contact Outcomes





Of the 346 successful contacts with the person that overdosed (Client Only and Both): 71% (244) resulted in the individual accepting services from the outreach team; 17% (60) declined the offer of services; and 12% (42) of the individuals were already seeking services.
