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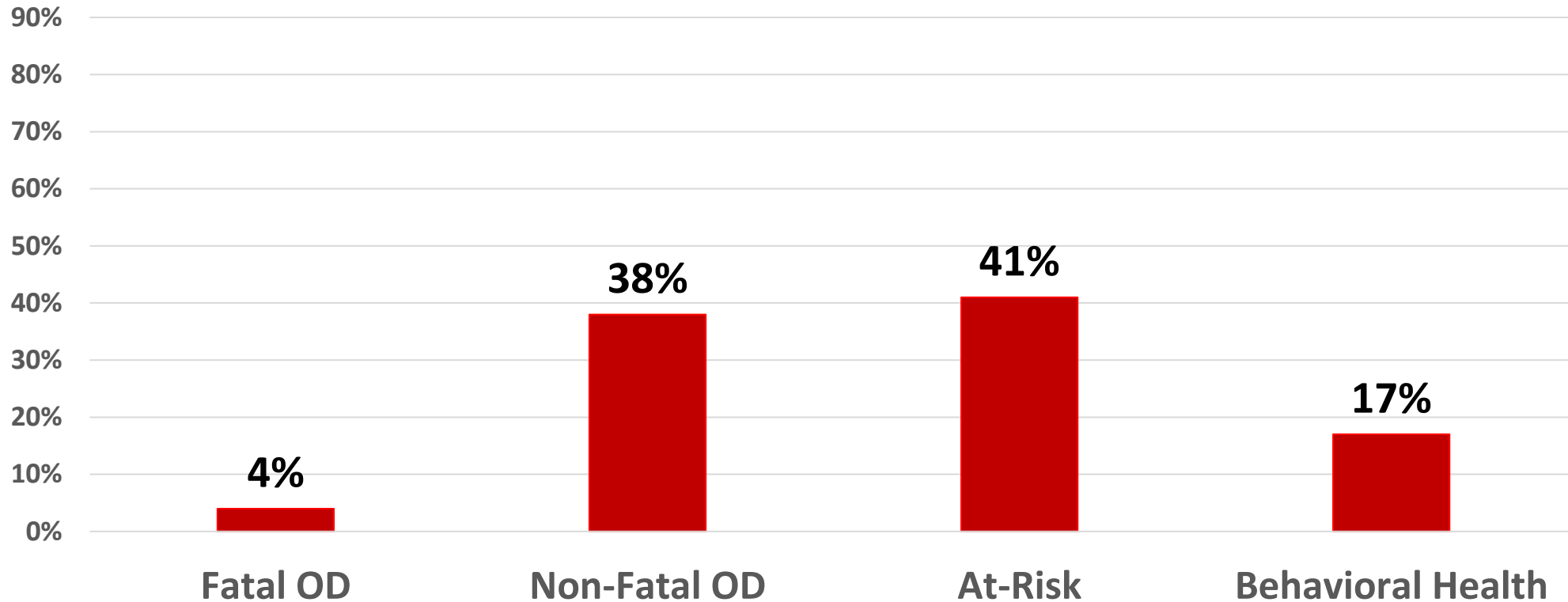

County-Wide Preliminary Data

Type of Incident: 1/1/26 – 7/31/26

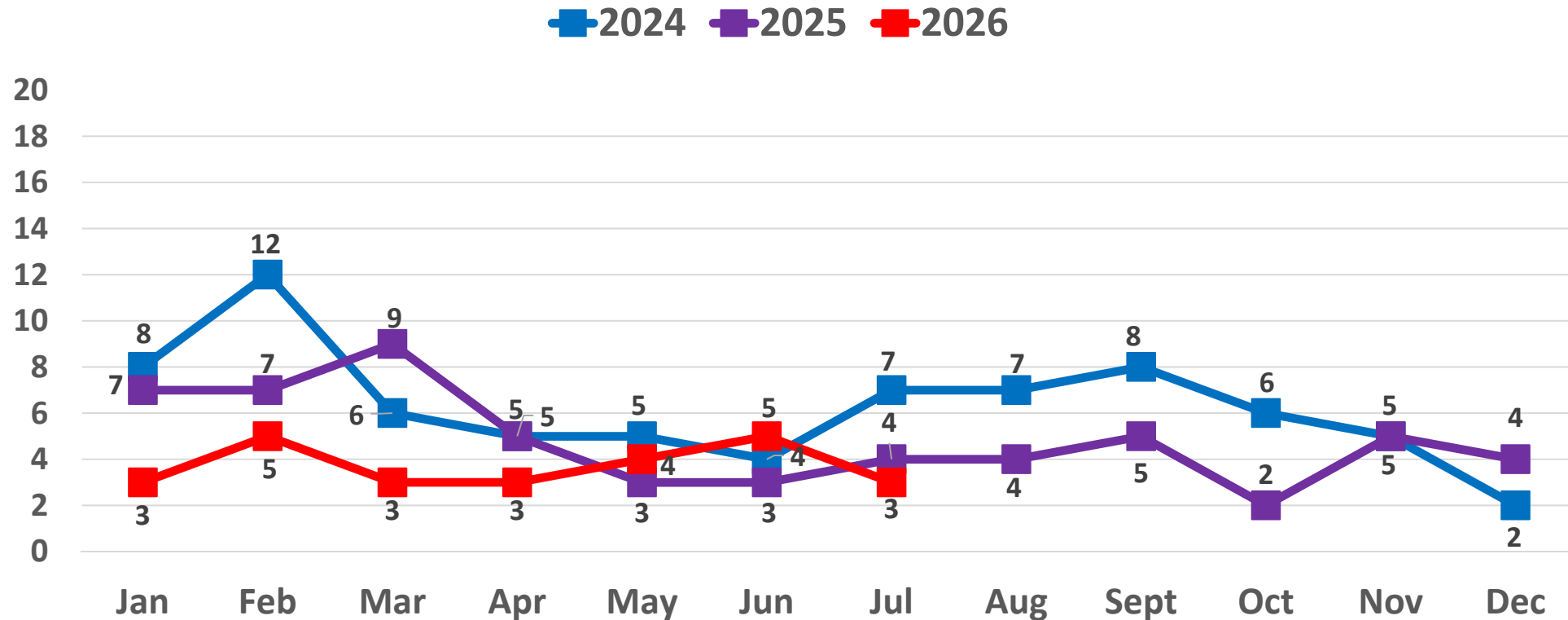


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There were a total of **617 incidents (OD incidents, At-Risk Referrals, and Behavioral Health incidents)** recorded in Plymouth County between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26: **26 (4%) involved a fatal overdose; 235 (38%) involved a non-fatal overdose; 254 (41%)** were categorized as an “at-risk” individual, and **102 (17%) involved Behavioral Health incidents.**

Fatal Incident Monthly Trend

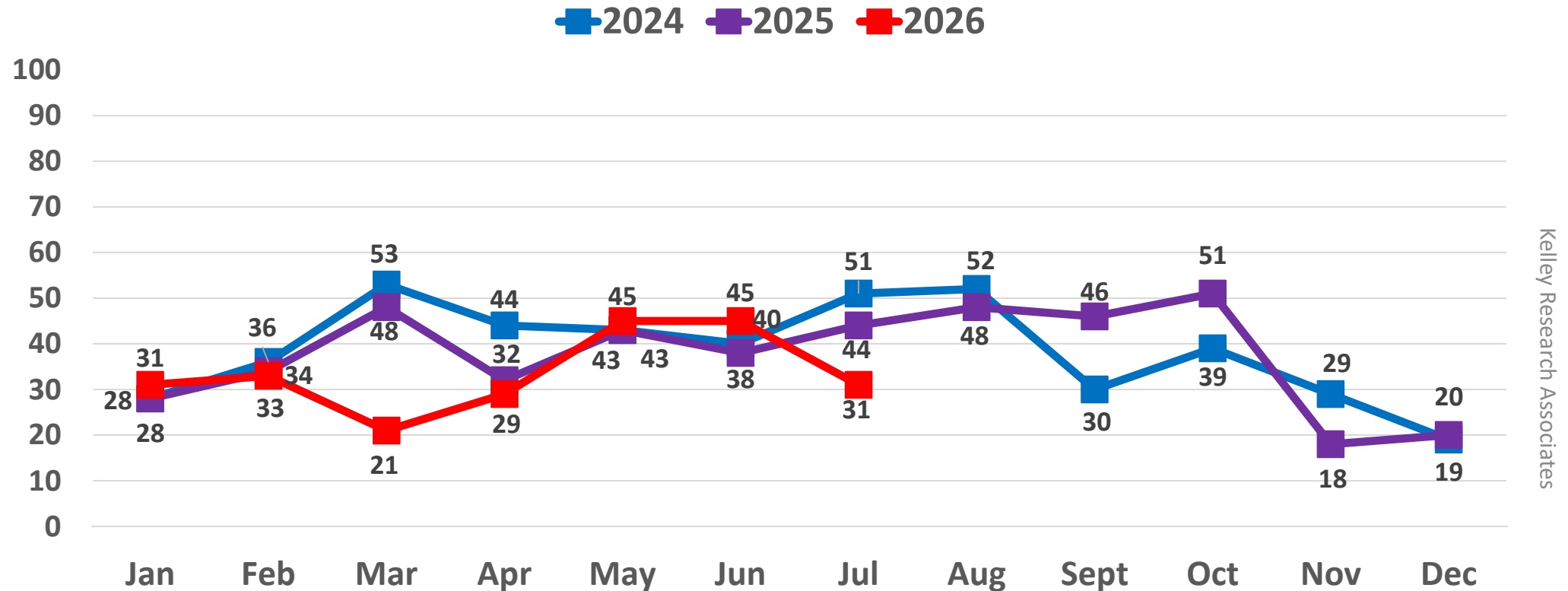


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There was on average 3.7 fatal ODs per month, or 26 total, in the County between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26. This is a 32% decrease over the 2025 monthly average of 5.4 or 38 total, for the same time frame.

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Non-Fatal Incident Monthly Trend



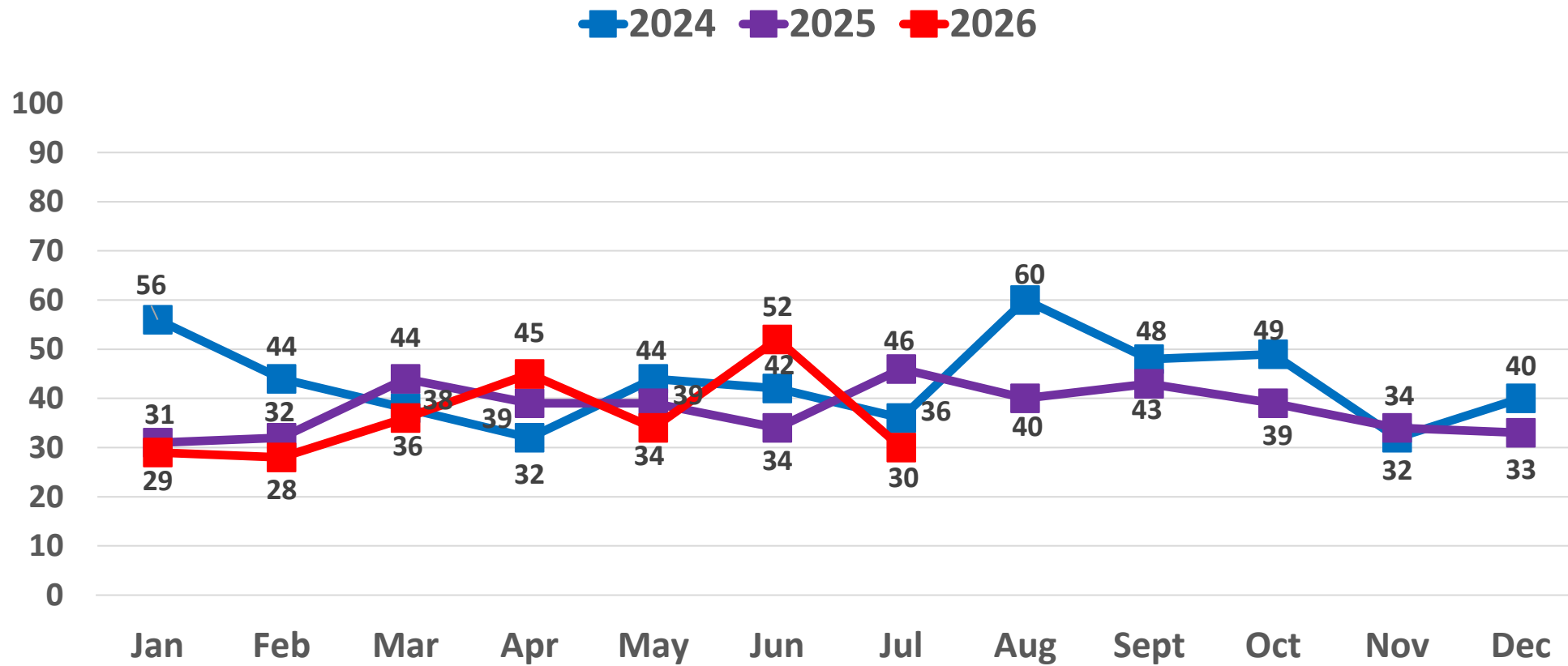
There was on average 33.6 non-fatal ODs per month, or 235 total, in the County between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26. This is a 12% decrease over the 2025 monthly average of 38.1 or 267 total, for the same time frame.

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At-Risk Monthly Trend



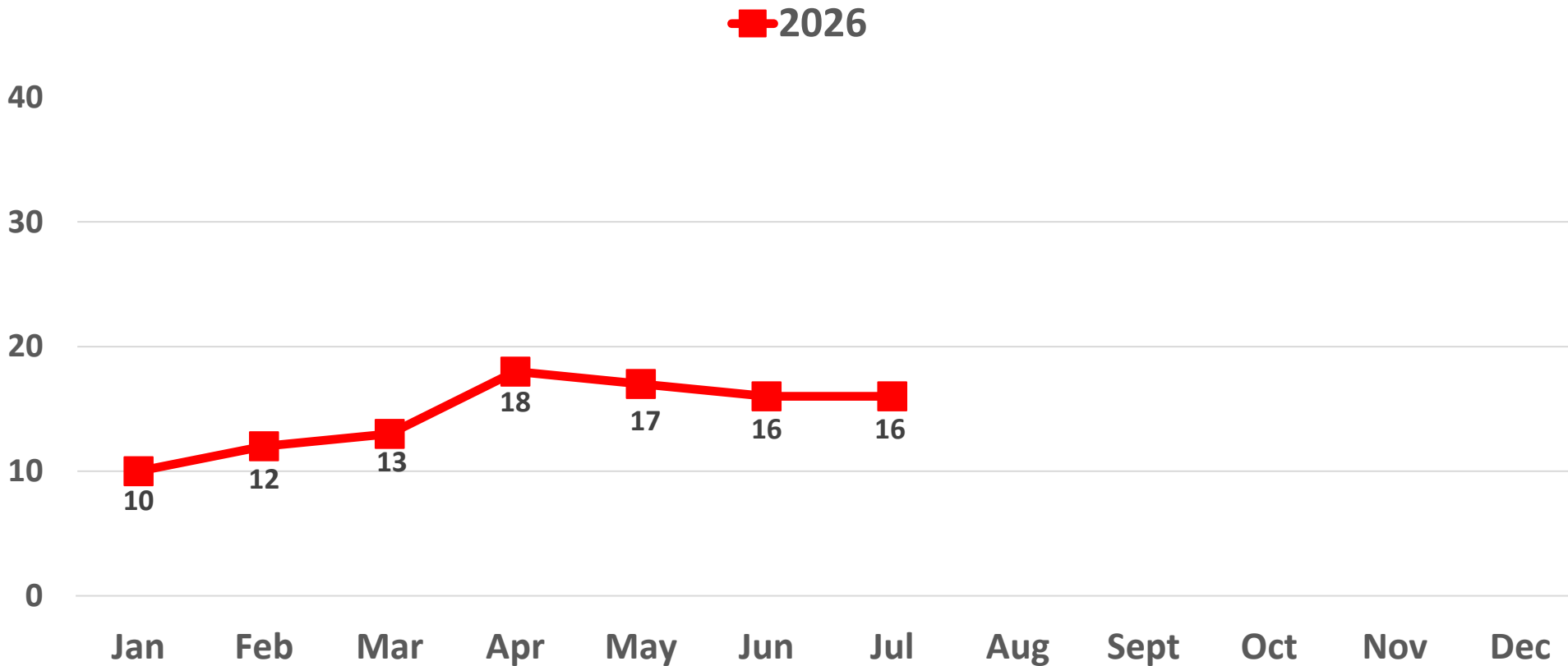
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There was on average 36.3 At-Risk entries per month, or 254 total, in the County between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26. This is a 4% decrease over the 2025 monthly average of 37.9 or 265 total, for the same time frame. Of note, 78% (197) of the at-risk entries during this time frame are related to individuals with alcohol use disorder.

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Behavioral Health Monthly Trend



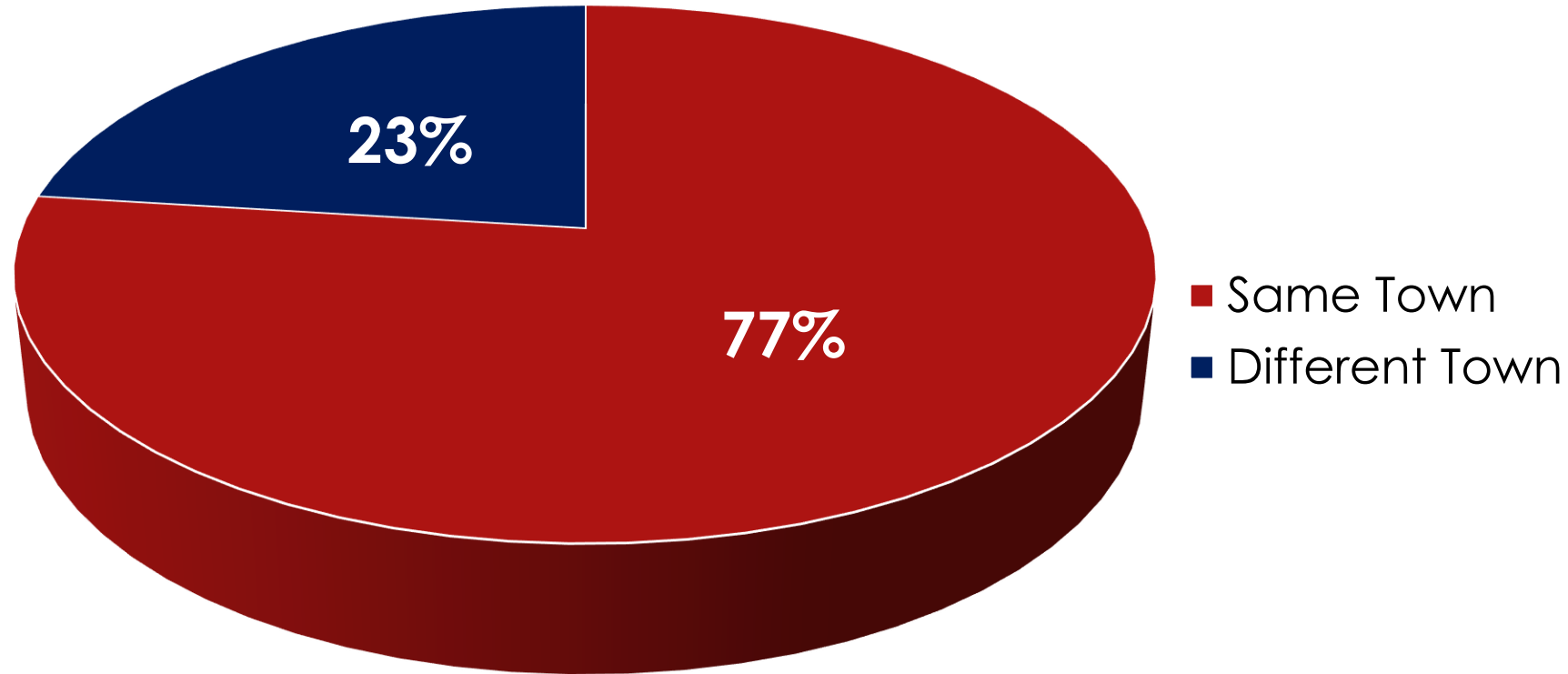
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There was on average 14.6 Behavioral Health entries per month, or 102 total, in the County between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26. Utilization of the CIMS Behavioral Health module recently began in Plymouth County. There is not prior data to compare to at this point.

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Incident vs. Resident Town:

1/1/26 – 7/31/26



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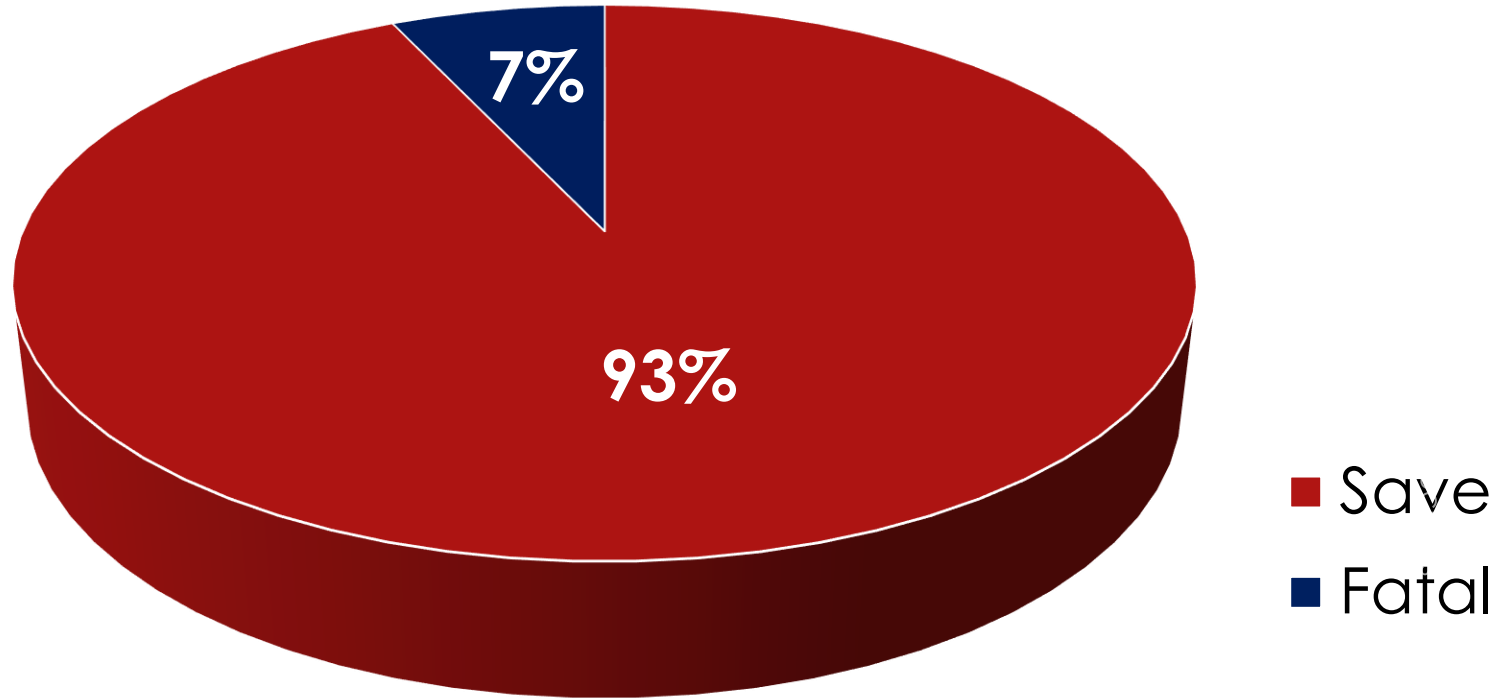
Analyzing just the 261 overdose incidents, **200 (77%)** of the OD incidents between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26 occurred in same town that the person lived in. However, in **61 (23%)** of the incidents the person was from a different town than where the incident occurred.

Naloxone "Saves": 1/1/26 – 7/31/26



Forty-three percent

(66) of these incidents involved Naloxone being administered by a 3rd party family/friend prior to first responders arriving.



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Again, analyzing just the 261 overdose incidents, Naloxone was administered in **153 (59%)** of the reported OD incidents. **Ninety-three percent (143)** of these events were non-fatal, while **7% (10)** of these overdoses resulted in a fatality.

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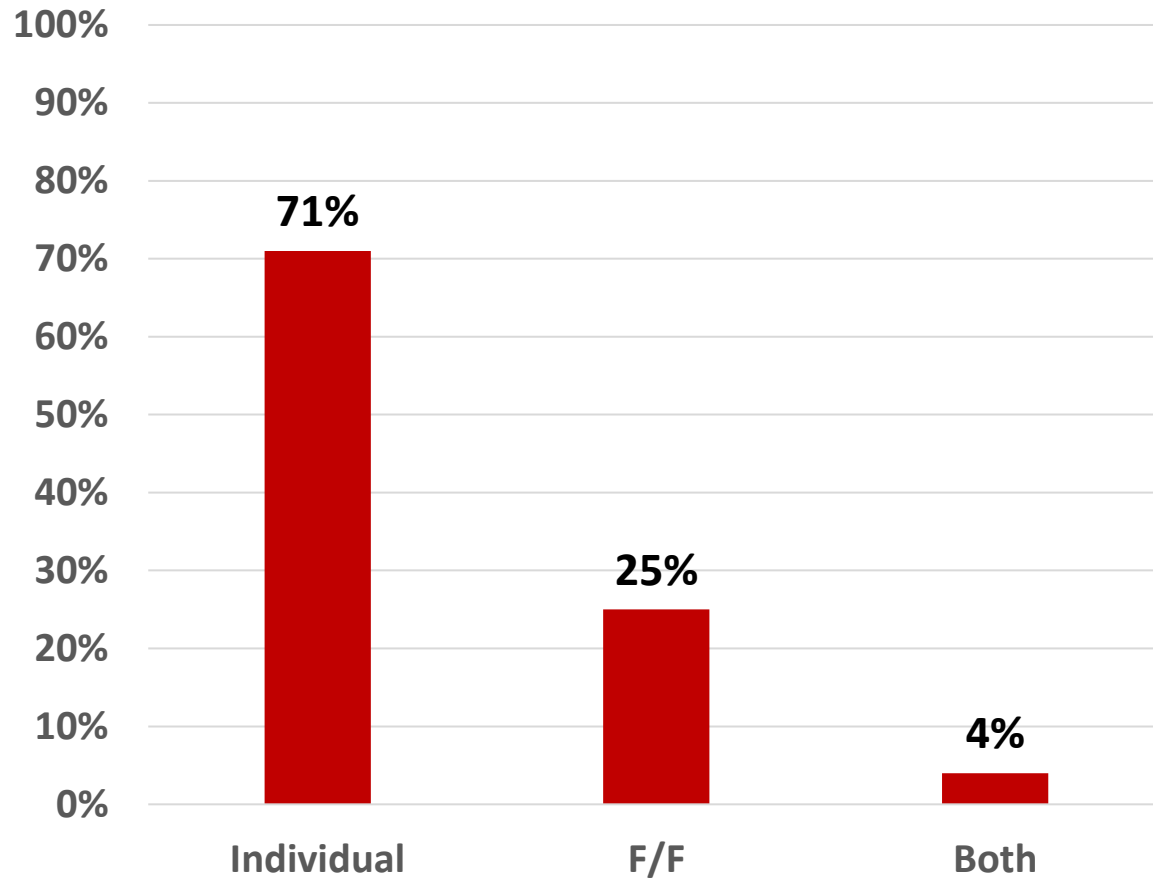
Follow-Up Contact Data:

1/1/26 – 7/31/26



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- 1,019 attempted Follow-up Contacts
- 55% (557) were successful in having contact with either the individual involved in the incident, a family/friend, or both.



Seventy-one percent (392) of the successful follow-up contacts (557) resulted in contact with the individual who was involved in the incident or was referred, 25% (141) resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and 4% (24) resulted in contact with both the individual and family/friends.

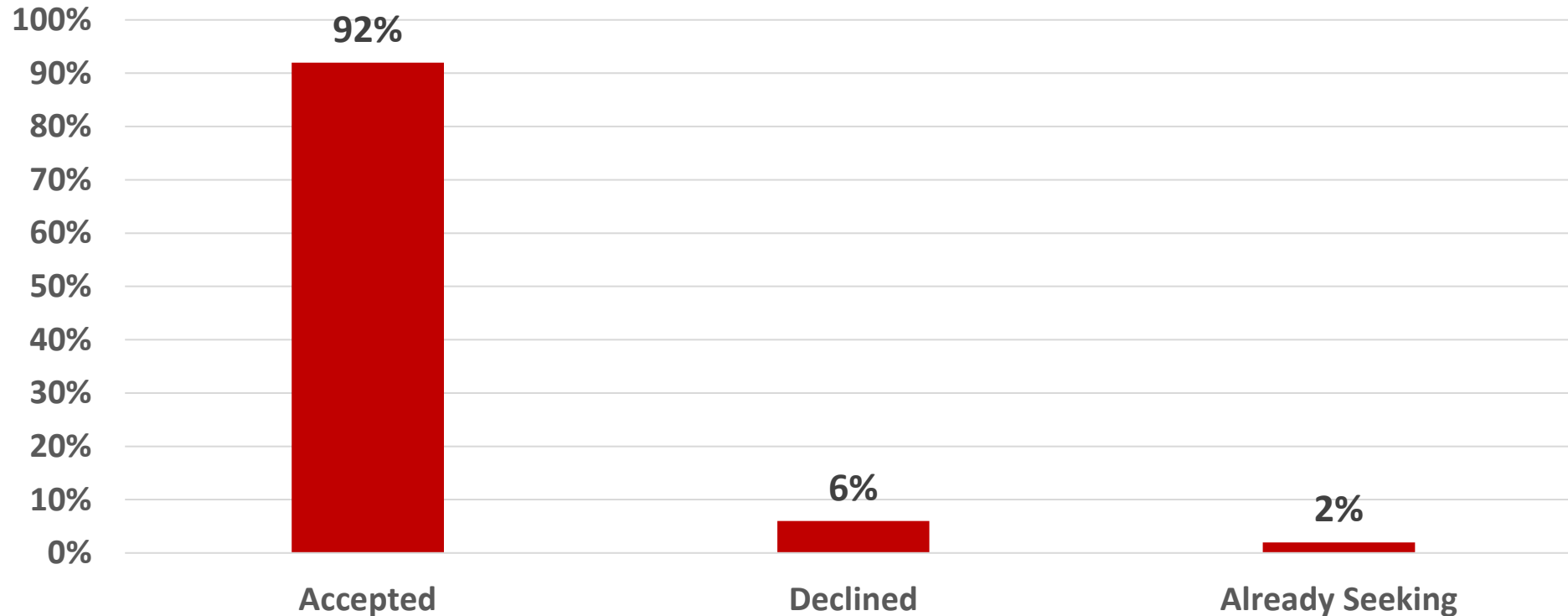
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Successful Client Contact Outcomes

1/1/26 – 7/31/26



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Of the 416 successful contacts with the person involved in the incident (Individual Only and Both): **92% (384)** resulted in the individual accepting information/resources from the outreach team; **6% (24)** declined the offer of information/resources; and **2% (8)** of individuals were already seeking services.

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Tier 2 Follow-Up Analysis

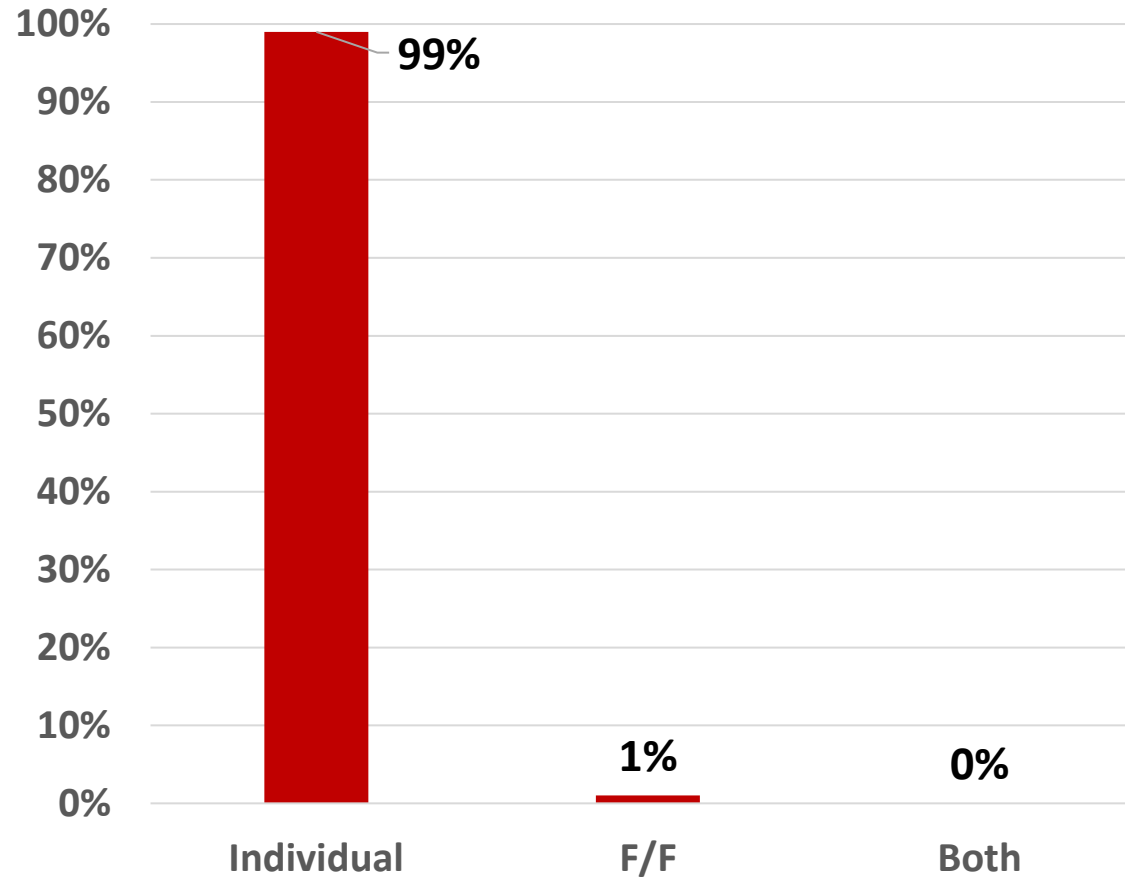
Tier 2: Follow-Up Contact Data

1/1/26 – 7/31/26



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- **499** attempted outreach visits (in-person, phone, electronic, other)
- **52% (260)** were successful in having contact with either the Tier 2 client, a family/friend, or both.



Ninety-nine percent (257) of the successful follow-up visits (260) resulted in contact with the Tier 2 client, **1% (2)** resulted in contact with Family/Friends, and **<1% (1)** resulted in contact with both the Tier 2 client and family/friends.

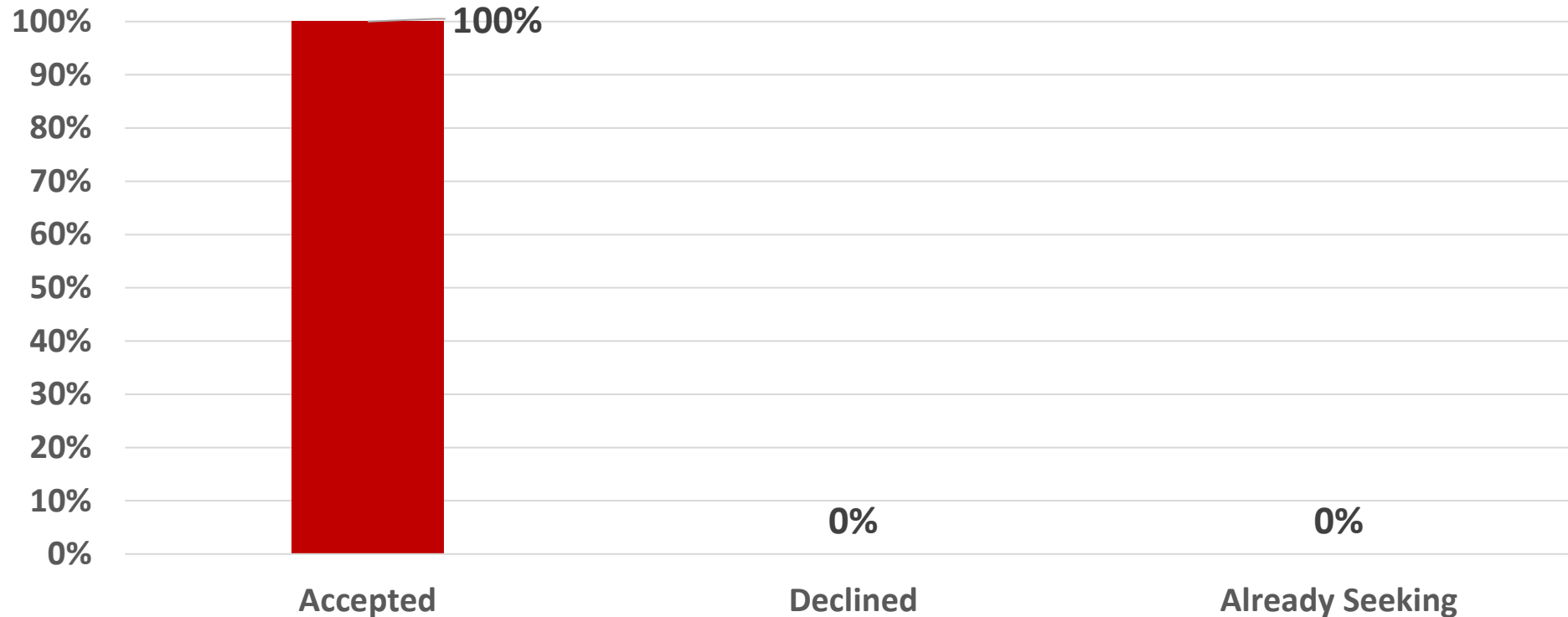
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Tier 2: Successful Contact Outcomes

1/1/26 – 7/31/26



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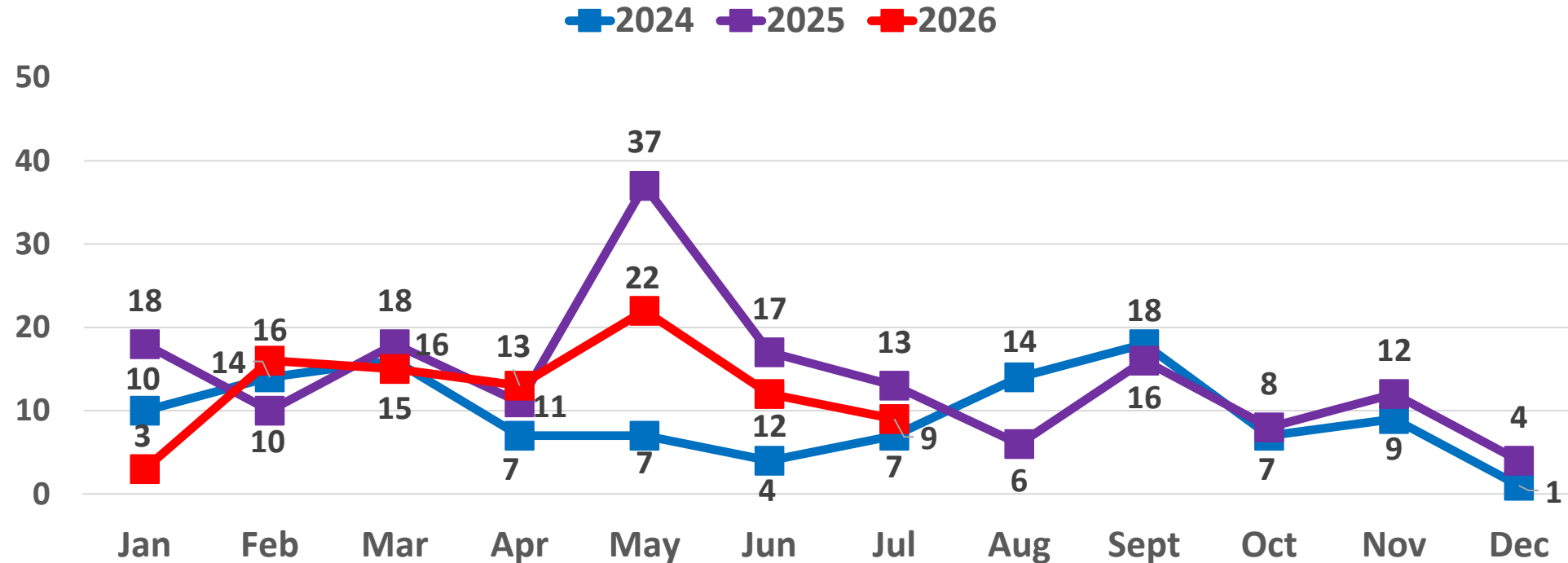
Of the 258 successful contacts with the Tier 2 client (Individual Only and Both): 100% (257) resulted in the individual accepting information/resources from the outreach team; <1% (1) declined the offer of information/resources; and 0% (0) of individuals were already seeking services.

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Hospitality Center Update

Hospitality Center Contacts



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There was on average 12.9 hospitality center contacts, or 90 total between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26. Seventy-nine percent (71) were recorded as Hospitality contacts (i.e. not a prior PCO client) and 21% (19) were existing Tier-2 client contacts. Of note, 57% (51) of these contacts took place at the Hospitality Center in Kingston and 43% (39) took place in Brockton during PCO outreach efforts at that location.

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Hospitality Center Services Requested

❑ Hospitality Center service requests included:

❖ Recovery Coach/Peer Support	57 (63%)
❖ Social Visit	32 (36%)
❖ Treatment Options	18 (20%)
❖ Housing Assistance	17 (19%)
❖ Basic Needs	16 (18%)
❖ ID/S.S./Birth Cert. Help	9 (10%)
❖ Other	25 (28%)
❖ This data can add to more than 100% since more than one service can be requested at each visit	

Hospitality Center Supply Distribution

- In addition to the 90 hospitality center contacts requesting services, another 43 visits involved PCO partner agencies or community members dropping in at the Kingston location to receive supplies.
- Supplies provided between 1/1/26 and 7/31/26 include:
 - 427 Boxes of Naloxone
 - 86 Harm Reduction Kits
